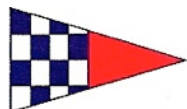

The policies of the NBYC state you **MUST** provide a copy of your current insurance policy to the Harbour Master. Whether your boat is in the water or on the hard, your boat is still on NBYC property.

Therefore, we will be charging an Administrative fee of \$50 to all members who do not provide a current insurance policy to the Harbour Master by September 1, 2010.
