Harbour

Reminder

Here are a few reminders for all of us:

- ❖ Keep your halyards tied off so that they don't clang in the wind
- ❖ Keep anchors & bow pulpits from going over docks so that the docks are free of obstacles for the safety of members
- ❖ Make sure electrical cord are not across docks and crossing walkways
- ❖ Don't leave stuff in front of the Nimbin and break down large boxes so that they don't fill the Nimbin
- ❖ Clean up any blocking you have in the parking lot. If not labelled and stacked neatly, it will go into the Nimbin.

Pump Out

The pump out was serviced this past winter and a new simple on-off system installed.

To use the pump out:

1. Screw the adapter into the deck fitting.
2. Attach pump out hose to adapter
3. Press red button.
4. Open the valve
5. When holding tank is empty, close valve.
6. Remove from deck
7. Put nozzle in lake and open valve to rinse out hose.
8. **CLOSE VALVE** and hang up hose.

Pump out will turn off automatically in five minutes.

Since Bruce had the clubhouse painted, more volunteers have taken the initiative to beautify the club.

Safety

AED - Automated External Defibrillator

We now have an AED at the Club. An AED is a portable device that automatically diagnoses heart attacks and treats them through defibrillation. It uses simple audio and visual commands for use by laypersons.

Bill has kindly installed it inside the clubhouse on the lower level beside the bulletin board.

A demonstration of the device will be held at the September General meeting. there is also a DVD/CD on how to use it that will be uploaded to our website.

Fire Extinguisher

Michel Mino, Safety Officer has purchased a fire extinguisher for the docks. He installed it on the post beside the bottom of the stairs into the clubhouse.

This is for use by anyone in case of fire on the docks or the property. We also have one inside the clubhouse. Let's hope they are never needed!

The cost of our ice is still cheaper than elsewhere, plus it's much more convenient!



Shirley and I were the first paying customers for the new Marina in Sturgeon. KOA Sturgeon Falls are the operators.

The docks are complete with lots of room for overnight slippage. Cost \$15, Pump out is \$15. No fuel yet, but this is available at Marinas on the river. Twiggs is supposed to open mid August, but limited progress has been made on this front.

Personal viewpoint

Travel Time:

Shirley and I have been visiting for three years now. We have found Sturgeon to be a great destination. There is 8' and more at the mouth this year. We anchored at Cailey's cove and motored through Canoe Pass, then between Big Sandy and Small Sandy Island into Nipissing, heading toward north side of Iron Island continuing to the mouth of Sturgeon River.

It is very well marked, with channel markers well out into the lake. We sailed and motored as needed. Travel time was 3 hrs, with 20 min or so on the river.

If traveling from **NBYC**, I would stay **Friday night** at the **Manitou's** and go to Sturgeon Saturday morning, about 3 hrs, plus river time. Coming home it took us 5 hrs last time, but I have an extremely fast boat.

Amenities: Good docks, ice at small store, hot showers free with overnight dock. Full 24 hr video security. Very nice walking trails.

Sturgeon Falls : 5 min walk to Rexall Pharmacy, Tim Hortons, Chip trucks, Don's Meats, Grocery stores, Loraine's restaurant for good breakfast. Clothing stores, LCBO and Beer store.

Meals: Sturgeon is super at fast foods, but does not so well for a fine meal. So if you go with this expectation, it's very good.

Sturgeon Falls Fiddle Fest:

I was first thinking the Aug 11 would be best, but have since found out **Aug 18th** is better as this is the finishing weekend. Shirley and I will be in the French River this previous week and will likely head to Sturgeon Sat. morning. I will put something up in the Club House. It will be difficult to manage anything official as plans are so much up in the air. However, once we are there I am sure we will get some press.

Tickets are available at the Metro Food stores in North Bay and in Sturgeon Falls. They are also available at West Nipissing Information Centre and both Four Seasons stores in Sturgeon Falls.
